ADVENT DEVOTIONS Tuesday, 9 December 2025

Scripture: Isaiah 12:2-6 (NRSV)

Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid, for the Lord God is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. And you will say on that day: Give thanks to the Lord, Call on his name; make known his deeds among the nations; Proclaim that his name is exalted. Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth. Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

Words and their meanings have always fascinated me. One of my favorite words is *catawampus*! According to the small piece of paper on the side of my refrigerator, *catawampus* is an adjective which means *askew* or *awry*. As an octogenarian, I have had a few days like that, wondering where to focus my energy or whether I have the energy to focus.

In this season of Advent our daily devotions help us refocus and today's citation from Isaiah provides us with a recipe of action words. "But Christmas is coming," you say, "and I have so much to do – gifts to buy and wrap, meals to plan, decorate the tree . . .!" Yes, the hurry flurry of the holidays often dulls the deeper heart call to "get quiet." The challenge is to make time to give thanks, call on his name; make known his deeds; proclaim, sing praises, shout aloud and sing for joy! As our hymn tune reminds us, Thee we would be always blessing, serve thee as thy hosts above, pray and praise thee without ceasing, glory in thy perfect love (ELW 631).
